AUTISM/ASPERGER ADVICE SESSIONS

Leeds Library and Information Service in partnership with STARS (Education Leeds Autism Response Service) and Leeds ABC will help you with advice on issues relating to individual children and young people with autism and their specific needs as well as information and support for parents. Library staff will help you use Boardmaker to design and print visual resources. All sessions run from 10.00am to midday on the 3rd floor meeting room of the Central Library. This will be a standing item under "Diary Dates".

BOARDMAKER (PECS SYMBOLS) in 9 MORE LEEDS LIBRARIES

The software programme, Boardmaker, has thousands of symbols and images that can be printed and used to support visual communication e.g. communication boards, visual timetables and social stories and is available in 25 libraries across Leeds. Parents and Professionals can book sessions with a librarian to learn how to use the software or use the software independently to print boards and symbols. Each library has a laminator so that you can laminate your boards and symbols after printing. There is no charge for using Boardmaker in

libraries or for laminating your boards and symbols, but there is a charge of 15p per page for printing. The libraries are:

CHILD TRUST FUNDS

A Child Trust Fund (CTF) is a long term savings and investment account for children born on or after 1st September 2002. Each child automatically receives a voucher from the government for £250, which their parents can use to open a CTF account. Children who live in low income families are eligible for an additional trust fund payment of £250. The government will then make further payments, of either £250 or £500, after each child's seventh birthday. This money is then invested for your child and will grow over time until they reach the age of 18. **Please note** that starting from April 2010; the government will make extra payments into the CTF accounts of children with a disability. In order to qualify for an additional payment, your child must have been in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (DLA) at some point during the previous year. The extra payment will be £100 per year or £200 per year if your child gets the highest care component of DLA. The government expects to automatically identify those children who have both DLA and a child trust fund and will make a payment directly into each child's account. Parents will receive a letter telling them once a payment has been made. If your child has a CTF and is in receipt of DLA, **please check** that you receive this entitlement.

Special writing paper to help improve writing skills

Raised ruling paper by Mead is designed to help improve children's writing skills. The lines have an embossed texture and add a tactile, multisensory element to writing. Since using this paper, my daughter can now write in a straight line. After being prompted to feel the line with her finger, she seems to be able to focus more clearly on writing a simple sentence. The paper is mainly available in the USA but Spacekraft sell it in their catalogue. There are two types available, letter (5 lines per page) and junior (9 lines per page). Leeds ABC Youth Group - The Next Generation The story so far.....

The Leeds ABC Youth Group has been running since March 2009 and was founded by Mandy Craven (vice chairperson of Leeds ABC). It caters for young people with Asperger's Syndrome or High Functioning Autism aged 11-16 and runs from 6pm-8pm every Wednesday (term time only, £3 per week). In January this year the group was established at the Burley Lodge Centre and initially some funding was obtained from Aiming High for Disabled Children (this is now spent!). Each week, different activities take place. Activities so far have included; arts and crafts (making Chinese dragons, stained glass windows with acetate), social skills games, trips to Hollywood Bowl, a K-Nex building competition. Future activities include a workshop at the Carriageworks theatre and a trip to the Magna science museum. The group has grown since January and a number of enthusiastic, CRB checked volunteers help out at the group with the activities.

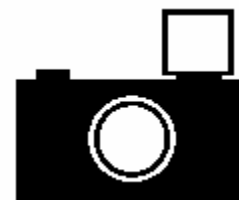
Click Project

Click is an 8 week multimedia programme run in partnership with Leeds Central Library.

These sessions run for two and a half hours, once a week. Click can be accessed by young people with additional needs aged 16-25. Young people can learn to use a digital camera, a computer, photoshop, make your own artwork and gain some new skills. The project is accessible to young people who are still at school or college as part of their learning. It can also be accessed by young people who are not in education or employment training (NEET). Projects run throughout the year. The next one is April 23rd to June 25th.
